HCZ Overview –

1. Consists of holistic programming using a wraparound and continuum concept to build Harlem's community and constituents.
2. Address health, education, and community resources
3. Started small with 4 blocks and blossomed to 96

Individual Fit to Hartford Children's Initiative

1. Carmen – Mayor's Office for Young Children
 - a. Must get commitment and follow through from Hartford agencies
 - b. Mayor's Office for Young Children has a lot of data that can be used to address, assess and evaluate needs
2. Troy – Hartford Parks and Rec/Health and Human Services
 - a. Expressed concerns about creating a program or putting large resources in a lose/lose situation. Better to funnel or create in a win/win situation in order to create buy in within the community
 - i. Obstacles to Community Commitment/Buy-in (Chris's curiosity/response)
 1. Transportation? Daycare? Adult Literacy (Chris)
 2. Each neighborhood is different – personality, structure (Troy)
 3. Top Down Management within city government (Carmen)
 4. Lack of community trust between city and citizens
3. David – UConn Center for Undergraduate Education
 - a. Volunteers
 - b. Partnerships with UConn, providing "manpower"
 - c. Positive reinforcement; identify carrots to motivate Hartford kids to succeed
 - d. Here really to observe and listen in to determine how UConn can assist in effort
4. Forgot name – Hartford Foundation for Public Giving (young lady)
 - a. Brighter Futures Initiative – 5 centers are established already
 - b. Community Engagement Surveys – volunteers canvassed Hartford households with kids 8 years old and under; report is currently in draft form, will provide more data for research
 - c. Must break silos between Hartford groups
5. Tom – Dean, UConn Neag School of Education
 - a. Commitment to working in Urban Schools
 - b. Understand role Neag can play and provide

Goals

1. Identify a neighborhood in Hartford to connect parts that already exist.
2. Identify elements of pipeline that are missing and address those needs

School system – Resource and Challenge

1. Disconnect between schools – magnet v. choice schools v. community schools
2. Underutilized resource

3. Community Schools (Clark, Simpson Waverly, Wish) are drowning due to lack of \$\$, but are good models because they have built in programs – literacy assistance, family resource centers, etc.
 - a. Use the disconnect btwn choice and community schools to our advantage (Chris)
 - b. Must find a way to get community to buy into these schools so they can be used as conduits (possibly) or created Promise Academies within these existing schools
